Subarea Health Planning Councils (SACs) Activities

Kauai The Kauai County Subarea Health Planning Council (KCSAC) met on January 10, 2019. Ms. Marion Paul, President of Kauai Planning and Action Alliance and Coordinator of Keiki to Career, gave a presentation on the "2018 Kauai Youth Report and the Kauai Resilience Project." Questions were entertained during and after the presentation. The next meeting will be on April 11, 2019.

Honolulu The Honolulu Subarea Health Planning Council (HONSAC) met on January 3, 2019. The members decided to work on an "Aging in Place" project. The next meeting will be on February 7, 2019.

Oahu** The West Oahu Subarea Health Planning Council (WOSAC) and the Windward Oahu Subarea Health Planning Council (WISAC) did not have a scheduled meeting in January 2019. The next meeting will be on February 13, 2019.

Tri-Isle The Tri-Isle Subarea Health Planning Council (TISAC) did not have a scheduled meeting in January 2019. The next meeting will be on March 8, 2019.

Hawaii The Hawaii Subarea Health Planning Council (HCSAC) met on January 22, 2019. The Brush and Floss Workshops will now include adults younger than 55 years of age. Partnerships with other agencies will be sought to capture the expanded age group. The next meeting will be February 26, 2019.

Research and Statistics

SHPDA's annual health care utilization survey for calendar year 2018 will be distributed to health care providers in February 2019. Health care providers will be asked to complete and return the survey to the agency by May 31, 2019 deadline.

The Hawaii Health Data Center (HHDC) Project Team

The team continues to work with the data reporters on their submissions. As of December 31, 2018, the following data was received:

House Bill No. 1011 and Senate Bill No. 1237 were submitted to the Hawaii State Legislature as part of the Governor's legislative package. These bills seek to provide SHPDA with the authority to mandate the submission of Medicare Advantage (Part C) administrative data and health care services claims. On January 28, 2019, the House Committee on Health held a hearing and collected testimony on a proposed draft of House Bill No. 578. The proposed draft of House Bill No. 578 contained language identical to the language of House Bill No. 1011. House Bill No. 578, HD 1 was passed out by the House Committee on Health on January 31, 2019. The passage of any of these bills is necessary for the project to analyze the entire Kupuna Medicare population. Currently, the project can only analyze 55% of the total population.

The team continues to work also with the Department of Human Services' Med-Quest Division to assist with program transition and continuity.
