Subarea Health Planning Councils (SACs) Activities

- Kauai** The Kauai County Subarea Health Planning Council (KCSAC) met on June 20, 2019. Ms. Theresa Koki, Life Choices Coordinator, County of Kauai, gave a presentation on "Status and Plans for the Kauai Adolescent Treatment and Healing Center." The next meeting is tentatively set for September 12, 2019.

The members reviewed and made suggested changes to the first cut of the "Know Your Medication" public service announcement (PSA). Research and Statistics

As of June 30, 2019, the response rate for SHPDA's annual health care utilization survey for calendar year 2018 was at 90.2%. The research statistician is working to review and verify the information submitted by the health care providers, and to enter data for analysis. Health care providers who did not submit their 2018 utilization survey by the May 31 deadline were contacted by emails and/or phone calls regarding their submission.

Master MOA between Med-QUEST and University of Hawaii was executed on June 17, 2019. The final reports for the CCIIO Grants were submitted to CMS on June 28, 2019.
