

- Scholarships
















Things We Do....HOSA

Things We Do....Stupski Honors Program

Students apply and are expected to meet the following if accepted

- Be enrolled in Waimea High School's Health Program of Study and prescribed Early College courses.
 - 3 years with Health pathway, 6 courses with Certificate in Public Health
 - Health 140, Math 115, PH201, PH202, PH203
 - 6th course Psychology 100 during summer of junior year
- Stupski students enrolled in a rigorous course of study that will enable them to meet entrance requirements for KCC and/or a UH System.
 - Maintain at least C in early college courses to ensure credit earned
 - Pass EdReady English and Math placement tests through KCC

Stupski Honors Program

- Maintain satisfactory citizenship and attendance in all classes.
- Maintain relationships with EC counselors, school counselors, and academy teachers. This means all meeting appointments must be kept and attended regularly.
- Complete all homework assignments and commit to studying every night
- Attend additional tutoring sessions and/or intervention meetings if grades fall below 70%















