SHPDA	J. Lewin, Administrator, SHPDA reported progress on convening Councils on issues of value to SHPDA namely: Keiki, Kupuna, Data, and Universal Access. SHPDA will be introducing legislation to create a Task Force during the 2024 legislative session. The goal of the Task Force will be to advise the state on the future of healthcare in Hawaii.	
	SHPDA's budget request did not get funded; looking to alternative options to obtain funding.	
	The Ways and Means Committee approached the Department of Health to develop a healthcare oversight authority for Hawaii. DOH researched other state models and proposed five (5) possible options, several of which included SHPDA. Anticipating the introduction of legislation during the 2024 session relating to this matter.	
	SHPDA, in collaboration with the Hawaii MedQUEST program, will be applying for the All-Payer Health Equity Approaches and Development Model (AHEAD) grant. The application is due early March 2024. Grant details may be accessed at https://www.cms.gov/priorities/innovation/innovation-models/ahead .

Advisory Council Updates	Data (DAC). R. Hirokawa, Chair reported a well-attended first meeting. J. Lewin provided an overview and stressed the importance of the data piece in the future of healthcare planning. Anticipating updates from the Hawaii All-Payer Claims Database, Hawaii Health Information Exchange, and the Laulima Data Alliance at the meeting on December 5, 2023.	
	Keiki. W. Nihoa, Comprehensive Health Planning Coordinator, SHPDA reported on behalf of K. Holt, Chair, the inaugural meeting of the Keiki Advisory Council is tentatively being planned to take place in January 2024.	
	Kupuna (KAC). M. Ah Ho-Mauga, Chair reported a lively discussion on priorities; a plethora	

	from palliative to comfort care, active kupuna, gap groups, etc.; and brainstorming on how to approach and prioritize priorities. Plans are to have members participate in the Prioritization Process approved by the PDC ahead of the next meeting scheduled for December 8, 2023.
	Universal Access (UAC). P. Roeder, Chair reported a well-attended inaugural meeting on November 16, 2023. Members discussed the Notice of Funding Opportunity for the AHEAD Grant and how the UAC will support SHPDA. The next meeting agenda will include a summary of the AHEAD Grant and the results of a member survey to identify priorities and shape future meetings. P. Roeder commented an overlap among the Councils and suggested to convene a combined meeting in the future to avoid duplicating efforts. The next meeting is scheduled for December 20, 2023.
