PROJECT SUMMARY:

Kokua Healthcare (KHC) is a locally owned and operated nursing home care agency working with The County of Kaua'i Agency on Elderly Affairs (AEA), VA Pacific Islands Health Care System and providers throughout Kaua'i to serve clients and families in the community.

KHC desires to be a Medicare certified Home Health Agency (HHA) and to provide home health services to the residents of Kaua'i. HHA services will include professional nursing services (e.g. registered nurse visits, wound care, oncology care, etc.) physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, social services and personal care services. KHC will utilize its current Kaua'i office. It is anticipated that minimum capital expenditures will be incurred and operating revenues will cover increased operating expenses.

Headquarted in Kaua'i, KHC currently provides in-home care services (Medicaid waivered) on Kaua'i. KHC specializes in enriching the lives of those we serve by providing caring, compassionate, and wellness-focused in-home care and to provide an encouraging and supportive environment.

a) Relationship to the State of Hawai'i Health Services and Facilities Plan

Kokua Healthcare proposal meets the CON Criterion for relationship to the State of Hawai'i Health Services and Facilities Plan (HSFP) as follows:

This project is committed to delivering Medicare-certified home health care within the context of the priorities laid out in the Hawaii Health Services and Facilities Plan (State Health Planning and Development Agency 2009). This project promotes the State Health Plan goal to promote the long-term viability of the health care delivery system. KHC encourages and supports health education, promotion, and prevention. KHC is the ideal agency to address some of the Kauai Subarea Planning Council's priorities. KHC will enhance the subarea priorities of the increasing amount of caregivers, increasing access to services, and decreasing social isolation amongst Kupuna. KHC seeks to provide equitable access to health care services. Kokua Healthcare works to expand and retain the healthcare workforce to enable access to the appropriate level of care for our clients and the Kaua'i Communit

b) Need and Accessibility

This project seeks to deliver exceptional home health services tailored to the unique needs of Kaua'i's residents, with a particular focus on Medicare beneficiaries aged of and above. As per the Census data compiled by the Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism, Kaua'i County in Hawaii has witnessed a remarkable surge in its population, soaring by 79.35% since 2000. Notably, the segment of individuals aged 60 pears and you older has experienced a staggering growth of 212.62%, with over 19,895 individuals in this demographic, constituting more than 27% of the total population. The trajectory indicates an average annual increase of 1.1% in the overall population, while the older age group has surged at a rate of 3.5%. Projections further anticipate that by 2040, the number of individuals within this age bracket will surpass 36,000.

Against this backdrop, the healthcare landscape reveals a pressing need for expanded services. Kaua'i County currently boasts a total of 333 long-term care and short-term rehab beds yet staffing shortages have rendered only 255 beds available. On average, 227 beds were occupied daily in 2022. In light of the scarcity of long-term care facilities juxtaposed with the burgeoning elderly population, the imperative for additional home health care agencies becomes evident. Many individuals prefer the comfort and familiarity of receiving care within their own homes, a testament to the patient-centered ethos that underpins modern healthcare practices.

Moreover, home health care represents a financially prudent alternative amidst the backdrop of escalating healthcare costs. By delivering high-quality care in a cost-effective manner, this initiative aligns seamlessly with the overarching goal of enhancing healthcare accessibility and affordability.

This project will not only address the escalating demand for Medicare-certified Home Health Agencies (HHAs) but also broaden access to essential home health services throughout Kaua'i. KHC will allow access to services to all residents in the area, and in particular, the elderly, low-income persons, racial and ethnic minorities, women, persons with disabilities, and other underserved groups will have access to our services. As KHC steps forward as a pivotal addition to the HHA landscape, it pledges to enhance the overall healthcare ecosystem on the island by fostering collaboration with existing care providers, thereby ensuring seamless coordination and delivery of exemplary care to every patient, irrespective of their setting or circumstance.
