Call to Order	A quorum was established. The meeting was called to order at 11:03 a.m. by Robert Hirokawa, Chairperson, Health Data Advisory Council (HDAC) presiding.	
Roll Call	Member roll call.	
	Guests: T. Lobendahn, Office Clerk, Senator San Buenaventura's Office and Caroline Kunetake, Primary Care Coordinator, Department of Health, Office of Primary Care and Rural Health.	
	R. Hirokawa requested edits to today's meeting agenda from W. Nihoa, Comprehensive Health Planning Coordinator, State Health Planning and Development Agency (SHPDA). The following changes were proposed and accepted without objections: the addition of two items "4.a.vii" and "4.b.iv" as "Public Testimony".	
Minutes	Motion to accept the minutes from July 9, 2024, and September 4, 2024 meetings.

Uninsured Permitted Interaction Group (PIG)	Hawaii Health Information Exchange (HHIE). F. Chan, newly retired Chief Executive Office (CEO), HHIE, reported there was productive discussion from H. Hsieh, Executive Director, Laulima Data Alliance, Healthcare Association of Hawaii, and D.Taira, Professor, University of Hawaii, Hilo regarding the possibility of using standardized data from the American Community Survey Data (ACS) and supplement with data from other data sets from Hawaii Primary Care Association and HHIE that may provide more insight into the process.	
	R. Maitra clarified that this is his first official meeting as a member, after attending previously as a guest. He was unable to attend the PIG but can now participate. F. Chan, retired CEO of HHIE, will continue as a "community member," while R. Maitra, HHIE CEO, will represent HHIE on the DAC.	
	Laulima Data Alliance (Laulima): H. Hsieh presented an overview of the uninsured population using public data from the U.S. Census Bureau's	

American Community Survey

(https://data.census.gov/profile/Hawaii?g=040XX00US15) and the Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation (KFF) (https://www.kff.org.statedata/election-state-fact-sheets/hawaii/), along with private "member-only" data from the Laulima Data Alliance (https://dimensions.laulimadata.org). A copy of the presentation is attached to these minutes.

Discussion regarding the notably high number of uninsured patients at Hilo Medical Center and the potential opportunity to explore a project addressing this issue. In addition, questioning the data points. Data will be shared with Hilo Medical Center to validate.

American Community Survey (ACS). D. Taira chose not to present the ACS data, noting that Laulima incorporates ACS along with other data sources, making it a more comprehensive resource. D. Taira volunteered, with H. Hsieh, to review the ACS data and draft a report. J. Lewin mentioned that Governor Green aims to identify uninsured citizens, understand the reasons, and ensure all keiki have medical insurance. The findings could be shared with legislators to support legislation for covering keiki (and citizens) who fall through the cracks and are ineligible for Medicare and Medicaid.

Motion to use the standard definition of "uninsured" as described in the American Community Survey. accept the minutes from July 9, 2024, and September 4, 2024, meetings.

State Health Planning and Development

J. Lewin, provided the following updates:

Agency (SHPDA) Updates	 AHEAD Grant. Onboarding is underway for the AHEAD grant between DHS-MQD and SHPDA. The Grant allows states flexibility by bringing on consultants. Areas of focus: Primary Care, Hospital Global Budgets, Equity, spending in total and how it compares to inflation Vision – Medicare, Medicaid, and Private – provide the same coverage and reimbursement strategy. The All-Payer Claims Database will go live May/June 2025. Medicare Advantage data needs to be added. 2025 Legislative Priorities. Prior Authorizations was presented and discussed. SHPDA is exploring the use of technology to streamline prior authorization decisions at the point of care. A short discussion followed.







Health Insurance Coverage of the Total Population












