Call to Order	The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m. with T. McKeague, Chair, HCSAC presiding.	
Roll Call	Member and staff roll call.	
Meeting Minutes	Unanimous approval of March 18, 2025, and April 15, 2025, meeting minutes.

Administrator's Report	The Administrator's Report was distributed and reviewed.	
State Health Planning and Development Agency (SHPDA) Updates	J. Lewin, Administrator, SHPDA provided an administrative report, focusing on legislative updates and SHPDA activities.	
Opuales	Tobacco Legislation:     Discussed a proposed legislative effort for 2026 that would prohibit anyone born after a certain date from ever buying cigarettes. This is described as a symbolic effort, but several other states are attempting similar legislation. It was noted that this would also apply to vaping and other nicotine products.	
	<ul> <li>Proposed bringing back a plan to spend \$20–\$25 million to get all rural home providers in the state on the EPIC electronic health record system. This would improve care coordination and quality control by creating a centralized clinical data system. The previous year, the proposal failed due to a committee chair's concern that their county (Maui) was already on EPIC and would not receive any of the funding. The current finance committee chair, Chris T., is more open to the idea.</li> </ul>	

#### The" Big Fix" in Healthcare:

 Advocated for a single, nationwide administrative system for healthcare, like a "Medicare Advantage for all" model. This would streamline administration, reduce waste, and force insurance companies to compete on price, quality, and service rather than "secret" profit-making methods. Hawaii is proposed as a potential pilot state for this program.

#### Dr. Men-Jean Lee's Ultrasound Program:

• Shared information about a program led by Dr. Men-Jean Lee from Hawaii Pacific Health, that uses portable ultrasound equipment in rural areas to provide care for pregnant women who lack access to obstetrical services. The ultrasounds are sent electronically to obstetricians for review. This program aims to address the high rate of women in Hawaii who don't receive prenatal care until their third trimester. The speaker offered to personally fund a lunch to bring key stakeholders together to support this initiative.

#### Certificate of Need:

Discussed a certificate of need that was previously approved for a private company to build a cyclotron in Hilo and install PET scan machines in Hilo and Maui Memorial. The cyclotron would produce the necessary materials for PET scans, which are used to detect metastatic cancer. The project has not yet been implemented.

## Staffing and Data Initiatives

 Vacancies: Noted that a position left vacant by "Wendy" is still being filled, but there are one or two candidates.
