Speaker Summary & Talking Points

1. Call to Order and Roll Call

- Melissa Ah Ho-Mauga called the meeting to order at 2:04 PM.
- Terry Visperas conducted the roll call, confirming that with 21 total members, they reached the necessary quorum (11 members present).
- New SHPDA staff member Jason Espero was introduced to the council.

2. Approval of Minutes

- The minutes from the October 31st meeting were reviewed.

- Stephen Kemble moved to approve; Cullen Hayashida seconded. The motion passed.

3. Long-Term Care (LTC) Financing PIG Report Overview

- Marilyn Seely provided a summary of the recently completed 120-page white paper regarding LTC financing.
- **Key Points:**
 - The primary focus is establishing a stable funding source for LTC to move away from silos and reliance on unpaid family care.
 - Research indicates a strong community preference for home-based care, which is currently expensive and lacks a sufficient workforce.
 - The report utilizes an economic simulation model specifically calibrated for Hawai'i's unique demographics and cost of living.
 - While several other states are adopting this model, Hawai'i faces significant legislative hurdles regarding appropriations this session.

4. Legislative Update (Kūpuna Caucus)

- Cullen Hayashida and Marilyn Seely clarified the status of the LTC proposal at the State Legislature.
- The proposal did not make the "Top 5" priority bills for the Kūpuna Caucus this year, largely due to strict budget restrictions and a moratorium on new state agency work mandates.
- However, there is still legislative interest, and individual legislators may still introduce related bills.

5. Formation of the LTC Implementation Permitted Interaction Group (PIG)

- Melissa Ah Ho-Mauga announced the need for a new PIG (3–7 members) to focus on the implementation of the white paper's findings.
- Terry Visperas explained that the PIG must remain under the quorum count (max 10 members) to operate as a working group not strictly bound by certain Sunshine Law posting requirements, allowing for more flexible collaboration.

Action Items

- **Council Members:** Interested individuals must email Terry Visperas or Melissa Ah Ho-Mauga to nominate themselves for the new LTC Implementation PIG.

- **Chair/Staff:** Finalize the PIG membership by January to begin reviewing the white paper and engaging with legislators/council members for "seed money."
- **Brandi Shima:** Requested to present at the next meeting regarding Medicare changes and medication coverage impacts on kūpuna.

Next Steps

- Establish the LTC Implementation PIG within the next month.
- Continue monitoring the legislative session for potential bill introductions.
- Prepare for a presentation on pharmacy/medication issues at the next scheduled council meeting.
