Test: Leptospira culture

Specimens for Leptospira culture will be Specimen receiving:

accepted from Monday through Friday from 7:45 a.m.

to 3:30 p.m., except on holidays.

Turn around Time: 6 weeks

Blood, urine or CSF must be inoculated by the Specimen requirements:

> submitting lab in EMJH media (pre-requested from DOH Lab). If using anticoagulant tubes (i.e. vacutainer), use heparin or EDTA, not citrated

tubes

Blood and CSF should be collected within the first 10 Specimen collection:

days of illness. After the first week of illness, urine may

be a better source of Leptospira. However, it is recommended that blood be cultured in all cases of suspected leptospirosis regardless of the date of onset.

Submitting lab must inoculate EMJH media Specimen inoculation:

prior to submission. (Please contact the Hawaii District

Laboratory at 974-4245 for EMJH media)

BLOOD: Inoculate 1-2 drops of blood to each of 4 tubes of EMJH.

CSF:

Inoculate 1-2 drops of CSF to each of 4 tubes of EMJH.

URINE: Inoculate 1-2 drops of undiluted, 1:10 dilution into duplicate

tubes of EMJH (4 total tubes per urine sample). Use

saline as the diluent.

DO NOT REFRIGERATE INOCULATED TUBES. EMJH TUBES ARE TO BE AT ROOM TEMPERATURE PRIOR TO INCULATION.

Specimens should be transported at ambient Specimen transport:

temperature to the laboratory. They should be securely sealed with parafilm to prevent leakage, and wrapped in aluminum foil to create a darkened environment. Tubes should be upright during

transport.

Requisition form:

- All specimens must be submitted with a legible 81.3 request form
- Requisition form must have patient name or other unique identifier
- Name of test requested
- Date of collection
- Submitter name and address
- Inclusion of patient symptomology.

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Normal value:

No Leptospira detected.

Result notification:

Final laboratory reports will be forwarded to the

submitter. A positive finding will also be called to the

submitting laboratory.

Comments:

EMJH can be pre-requested from Hawaii District

Laboratory by a submitting laboratory.

All positive cultures will be forwarded to CDC for

confirmation and to determine serovar.

Unacceptable conditions:

- Specimens not inoculated in EMJH media
- Leaking specimens
- Contaminated or overgrown specimens
- Illegible or incompletely-filled requisition forms
- Specimens have been refrigerated
- Specimen not labeled properly
- Improperly collected specimens
