## Trainer: Thomas E. Freese, Ph.D.

Dr. Thomas E. Freese is the Director of Training for UCLA Integrated Substance Abuse Programs and the Principal Investigator and Director of the SAMHSA-funded Pacific Southwest Addiction Technology Transfer Center (HHS Region 9). Dr. Freese has served as PI on training projects funded by SAMHSA, the CA Department of Health Care Services, and various county agencies and foundations. Dr. Freese has been a featured trainer and presenter at national and international conferences and meetings. He has worked in the addiction field since 1983, and has developed and conducted trainings in 46 U.S. states.

## Training Overview and Learning Objectives

The ASAM Criteria are used to provide outcome-oriented and results-based care in the treatment of addiction. They provide separate placement criteria for adolescents and adults to create comprehensive and individualized treatment plans to be used in service planning and treatment across all services and levels of care. This interactive, skills-based training will begin with a brief overview of the ASAM Criteria. Following this brief review, the remaining portion of the training will focus on a detailed review of four standard progress note formats (SOAP [Subjective, Objective, Assessment, and Plan]; GIRP [Goals, Intervention, Response, and Plan]; SIRP [Situation, Intervention, Response, and Progress]; and BIRP [Behavior, Intervention, Response, and Plan]). Following this review, instruction will be provided on how to develop a comprehensive, individualized treatment plan. Each progress note format will be reviewed in detail, and participants will have the opportunity to practice drafting progress notes through a series of guided case scenarios.

At the conclusion of the training, participants will be able to:

1. Demonstrate ability to link the six dimensions of multidimensional patient assessment to an individualized treatment plan.
2. Use progress notes to demonstrate movement toward attainment of treatment plan goals.
3. Demonstrate ability to use one of four standard progress note formats.
