- The Mobile Crisis Outreach team assists with meeting individuals in the community to begin continual care to assist with ending their homelessness.




Behavioral Health & Medical Support

- RYSE helps youth with medical and mental health visits, COVID tests and vaccinations, family planning, HIV and HepC testing, and more.

- RYSE's Behavioral Health team assists with linking clients to providers for therapy, psychiatric care, medication management, CCS coverage, etc.



Housing

- RYSE has a team comprised of highly skilled individuals who assist young adults with applying for housing vouchers, subsidized housing, and obtaining necessary vital documentation needed for housing applications.



Narrative Summary Report

- Hawai'i CARES call center continues to experience high call volumes
- Hawai'i CARES has been successful in coordinating client-centered care and linking clients to multiple services along their continuum of care. Examples of the success of an integrative behavioral health crisis care call center are noted below.
 - Client case #1- Client on neighbor island called CARES seeking treatment for alcohol related substance use disorder. Client was sober for 6 years prior, a former polysubstance opiate user, and started using alcohol again in the past few months; discontinued alcohol one week prior to calling CARES for help in staying sober. Client reported no withdrawals, but they had been taking buprenorphine for many years which limited them from a treatment facility on the island where they were located. Client was experiencing difficulty getting into treatment and called CARES discouraged and upset. The CCA and client discussed different services and options. The client liked the idea of a sober living home on Oahu and entering treatment. The following week, the client was able to enter a sober living facility with plans for outpatient treatment. Client is pending placement at a treatment facility and reports doing well at the sober living home.

Narrative Summary Report

Client case #2- Client called due to a court order for an SUD assessment. After referral for an SUD assessment was completed in WITS, the CARES CCA connected the client with the referring agency. The client was able to speak directly with the treatment/SUD assessment provider and an appointment time and date was agreed upon by both the agency and the client. The client was grateful for being able to directly speak with the provider and explore his options over the phone with the provider and HI CARES.

Narrative Summary Report

Client case #3- Client contacted CARES line needing crisis support services. Referral was made for bed stabilization and facilitated by the CCA. Due to a history of meth, opioids and IV drug use, the CCA also initiated referral for SUD assessment. Client was previously placed on methadone and was connected in this crisis outreach with CSM to assist client transportation for daily methadone dosing while at bed stabilization facility. An assessment was completed while the client was in the bed stabilization facility; treatment recommendation was made for residential treatment. Client entered into inpatient facility and successfully completed 30 days of treatment. Unfortunately, soon after client was in unstable housing situation and needed help for relapse prevention. Referral made to bed stabilization while connecting to housing resources. Client successfully connected to housing and is living in a tiny home community.
