





The Problem

- Excessive alcohol drinking costs our
 State nearly 1 Billion dollars per year
- 1 out of 3 traffic fatalities in Hawai'i involve alcohol-impaired drivers
- Hawai'i ranked 6th highest DUI fatality rate in the nation.

What is a BAC?

 Blood alcohol concentration, also referred to as BAC, refers to the percent of alcohol in a person's blood stream. A BAC of 0.10% means that a person's blood supply contains one part ethyl alcohol for every 1000 parts of blood. In Hawai'i, drivers over 21 test as legally impaired to drive a vehicle at 0.08% BAC.

Why lower the BAC?

This environmental strategy is backed by numerous studies that show:

- 1) There are significant signs of impairment at a 0.05 BAC
- Lowering to 0.05 BAC reduces drinking and driving and the related consequences.






Evidence-based Solution



BAC is a low-cost, effective deterrent strategy.


- NHTSA evaluation shows 19.8% drop in fatal car crashes as a result of lowering the BAC from .08% to .05%
- Consistent evidence of countries who moved from .08 to .05 saw at least a 5%-8% and up to 18% decrease in fatal and injury crashes
- It lowers drinking and driving for **all** BAC levels

Approximately 100 countries have adopted .05 BAC, including most industrialized nations. Australia, New Zealand, and much of Europe is already at .05 or lower.





Evidence-based Solution



Myth-Busting

- Lowering the BAC from .08% to .05% had no effect on alcohol sales
- Hospitality industry uses 'safer roads' to promote tourism in their State.
- No significant uptick in arrests rates when
 .05 was established in Utah
