This interactive 2-hour live virtual training is free and open to those interested in learning information on confidentiality, particularly as it relates to HIPAA and 42 CFR Part 2. Confidentiality requirements will be presented along with specific cases where disclosure of patient information is allowed. The training will also cover how to respond to a subpoena for protected patient information.

At the conclusion of the training, participants will be able to:

1. Describe at least three (3) differences in privacy and confidentiality rules for substance use counselors under HIPAA versus 42 CFR Part 2.
2. Identify two (2) examples of PHI that have to be maintained in treatment.
3. Specify three (3) different types of 42 CFR Part 2 programs to determine an organization's confidentiality responsibilities.
4. List three (3) conditions in which disclosures are allowed under 42 CFR Part 2.
5. Determine four (4) components that must be included in a Release of Information.

<p><b>5/29/24</b>  <b>Ethics Part II</b>  <b>Training Description,</b>  <b>Core Clinical</b>  <b>Components, and</b>  <b>Learning Objectives:</b></p>	<p>This interactive 2-hour live virtual training will introduce participants to the subject of ethical principles that underlie the provision of effective and principled substance use disorder and behavioral health treatment. This training will identify and describe issues around boundaries and dual relationships, and challenge participants to think about specific clinical situations that raise ethical dilemmas.</p> <p>At the conclusion of the training, participants will be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Identify at least three (3) basic ethical principles that are foundational to the practice of substance use disorder (SUD) and mental health treatment.</li> <li>2. Determine at least three (3) ethical considerations prior to making a self-disclosure to a client.</li> <li>3. Apply one (1) 10-part ethical decision-making process to a potential ethical dilemma.</li> </ol>
<p><b>6/5/24</b>  <b>Ethics Part III</b>  <b>Training Description,</b>  <b>Core Clinical</b>  <b>Components, and</b>  <b>Learning Objectives:</b></p>	<p>This two-hour live virtual training will explore some of the ethical issues raised by the ever-increasing use of technology in healthcare. Specific topics will include issues of self-disclosure, the use of email and texting technology with patients, and the issues inherent in the use of social media, both by patients and by providers.</p> <p>At the conclusion of the training, participants will be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Specify at least two (2) privacy risks of using email or SMS text messaging with clients.</li> <li>2. Explain at least two (2) issues regarding intentional and unintentional self-disclosure by treatment providers through the use of social media.</li> <li>3. Identify at least two (2) safe practices to secure your computer and mobile phone.</li> </ol>
