
Community Works in 96744, also known as CWC 96744, is a program of Parents And Children Together's (PACT) **Kaneohe Community** Family Center (KCFC).







BUILDING THE RELATIONSHIPS THAT MATTER MOST

CWC 96744 is a community coalition that works with its partners, members and community members to prevent underage drinking in Kaneohe on the island of Oahu.




Through the 2019 – 2020 Student ATOD Survey we learned that underage drinking was higher in Windward Oahu/DOE's Windward District (Waimanalo to Kahuku) than that of Honolulu County and the State:






The ATOD survey also showed that Windward had higher rates than Honolulu County and the State for two of the three most common ways youth got alcohol.


Most Common Way to Get Alcohol -Someone Gives it to Them 2019 - 2020 HI ATOD Survey



Second Most Common Way to Get Alcohol -Taking It From a Family Member 2019 - 2020 HI ATOD Survey



Third Most Common Way to Get Alcohol -Gave Someone Money To Buy It 2019 - 2020 HI ATOD Survey



This data showed us that the youth in our community had higher rates of alcohol consumption and based on higher rates of getting alcohol from others, "adult favorable attitudes" was a risk factor for underage drinking in our community.



PC: Everything Neon

To inform and educate our community on the importance of underage drinking prevention in Kaneohe 96744, CWC 96744 decided to create a prevention campaign that would reinforce:

- that adults cannot not serve/provide or allow underage youth to drink alcohol and
- that you must be at least 21 years of age to consume alcohol.

The result was our *Under 21? 'A'ole Alcohol!* campaign which we launched during FY 2023 (Oct. 2022 – Sept. 2023).



The first thing that we did was to create a logo to "brand" our campaign.

The logo is used in our marketing/education material, including:

 A sticker to disseminate at community events, hand out with business cards, include with give away items, etc.




• a banner that can be used at community events that the coalition hosts or participate in.

• the coordinator's electronic signature on her emails



In CWC 96744 collaborated with the State Department of Transportation to create prevention messages on the H-1 freeway boards for graduation season. The messages were displayed from May $6 - 31^{st}$.



We estimated that more than 80,000 people saw the signs during that time.

This was the first time CWC 96744 was able to take the campaigns message county wide.



Hawaii News Now did a story on the freeway signs on May 7, 2024, and ran it on the evening news and on their morning show on three of their channels, in all timeslots.

HNN also posted it to their social media platforms (YouTube, X, FB, IG).

Their media coverage was the first time CWC 96744 took the campaign message statewide.




