# **Smoke Free Environment**

In 2006 the Hawai'i State Legislature passed sweeping laws under <a href="HRS 3281">HRS 3281</a> prohibiting smoking in various enclosed and partially enclosed areas in the following areas. <a href="Effective 2016 this prohibition will include electronic smoking devices also known as e-cigarettes">Effective 2016 this prohibition will include electronic smoking devices also known as e-cigarettes:</a>

- 1. Work and education
- 2. Restaurants and retail
- 3. Hotels and multi-unit housing
- 4. Care and rehabilitation facilities
- 5. Indoor and outdoor recreation
- **6.Transportation**

Clearly legible signs that include the words **Smoking Prohibited by Law** with letters not less than an inch high or, the international "no smoking" symbol <u>shall be clearly posted</u> at entrances at places open to the public or places of employment were smoking is prohibited.

Individual agencies and multi-unit buildings such as condominiums have also enacted their own smoke free policies for their respective properties. Current state law restricts sales of electronic smoking devices (ESD) including e-cigarettes by persons under 18.

### 3. Hotels and Multi-Unit Housing

Smoking in hotels including ESD's:	
Smoking is prohibited in all enclosed or partially enclosed	
areas open to the public including but not limited to the	
following places:	
<ul><li>Lobbies</li></ul>	

- Meeting rooms
- **Banquet facilities**
- Hotels may not designate more than 20% of their rooms for smoking by guests.

NOTE: Hotels may establish their own policies making their entire building or franchise smoke free; i.e. Marriott.

### Smoking in multi-unit housing including ESD'S:

Smoking is prohibited in common areas such as:

- Hallways
- Lobbies

Other common areas fitting this description include:

- Mail rooms
- Laundry rooms
- Party rooms

NOTE: Residential apartment building boards can establish their own policies to make their entire building and grounds smoke free. The Coalition for a Tobacco Free Hawaii has useful information for tenants and apartment owners who wish to go smoke free.

### **Public Housing:**

All Hawaii Public Housing Authority public housing are smoke free [HRS 356D-6.5]



# **Electronic Smoking Devices (electronic cigarettes)**

Electronic smoking devices (ESD or <u>electronic cigarettes</u>, are battery-powered devices, some designed to look like regular tobacco cigarettes, which provide doses of nicotine and other flavored additives to the user in an aerosol.

ESDs are not marketed for therapeutic purposes and currently unregulated by the Food and Drug Administration.
