- Judith Clark of Legislative PIG provided an update that all bills presented at the April 29, 2025 Meeting passed legislation with no Governor vetoes. Highlights include: \$50 million allocation for nonprofits for critical services facing federal funding cuts, and Safe Spaces for youth bill.

- Task Force Co-Facilitator Ashley Petitt reviewed Trauma-Informed Care Task Force 2025 Recommendation Report Addendum. The Addendum documents ongoing progress and updated recommendations from the Task Force from January 2025 present. Areas of focus include:
 - The integration and emphasis of peers with lived experience as a vital component to a TI approach to direct service delivery and policy development.
 - Recommendations for assessing, capturing, and measuring the existing state, progressive timeline, and effectiveness of TIC initiatives across Hawai'i.
 - The Task Force's transition to an Advisory Board to the Office of Wellness and Resilience (OWR) on June 30, 2025.
- Task Force Members will have the opportunity to request amendments and vote to enact the report at the June 24, 2025 Meeting.

VII. Office of Wellness and Resilience (OWR) Updates – OWR Deputy Director Dr. Trina Orimoto provided the following updates.

- Office Updates:
 - o Resolution SCR73/SR56 Passed. This resolution requests OWR to develop a report addressing the developmental needs of children born during the cascading community traumas of the pandemic and Maui wildfires.
 - o Peer support working group is having a discussion about their framework at a meeting in person.
 - o OWR will be focusing on building pilina with legislators to share, more about OWR, the work being done, and to begin to partner with them.

- The March newsletter has been released. Participants are encouraged to subscribe to the newsletter mailing list.
- State of Well-Being Project is moving forward. OWR is looking at existing Tier 1 and 2 mental health and wellbeing supports exist for state and county employees, first responders, healthcare providers and in public schools.
- Training curriculum for trauma-informed certification being developed. Asynchronous and in-person cohorts will be launching this fall with full implementation by January 2026.
- o OWR will be presenting at: 1) Univisty of Connecticutt Training Institues around the framework for well being and mental health after traumatic events and their work in Maui; 2) Occupational Safety and Health conference about worker well being across different industries.
- Transition of Trauma-Informed Care Task Force to Advisory Board for the Office of Wellness and Resilience
 - **o** OWR to facilitate meetings.
 - o First meeting anticipated to be October 2025. Meetings will be quarterly.
 - o Designee invitations will go out by June 30, 2025.
 - o Meetings to remain under Sunshine Law.
