

Aloha, my name is Meredith Wilson and it seems like just yesterday I suffering in what was supposed to be my safe home. But simultaneously, I also feel I've aged decades instead of the two years it's been since Red Hill changed my life.

In last month's published Government Accountability Office report, they stated that the DoD has *not* provided enough information to Congress in order to properly appropriate funds for FY 2025 and beyond. This is where most of the site investigation & remediation will take place, so it's paramount for this to be clear to congressional decision makers and therefore the public.

The GAO mentioned that they evaluated a "Red Hill Spend Plan" document—is that publicly available and where?

The most recent NDAA also requires a briefing by the Secretary of Defense to congressional defense committees by the end of *this* month.

The topics to be covered are:

- Descriptions of the contaminants themselves,
- their potential health impacts in drinking water,
- and any potential benefits for broadening the health implication tracing window *prior* to May 2021.

When will this briefing take place and will it be publicly available?

At November's FTAC, Rear Admiral Barnett mentioned that the SecDef will also be the one to provide report to Congress about the (3) Non-Fuel Re-Use plans and would get this information out to the group. Any update on this?

Next, has DHA itself already briefed any congressional committees? If so, which ones & when?

Lastly,

What are the benefits of EPA letting DOH's Underground Storage Tank regulations take the lead instead of following RCRA?

This community has been so burned by the past pattern of bad behaviors by the Navy. Simply adding another year to Long-Term Monitoring when 2 years ago after the event we begged for 100% of homes to be tested, doesn't provide any kind of satisfaction.

In the past, they demonstrated *less* than the bare minimum. That clearly didn't work when our homes became a hazard and it sure as hell won't work in this reconciliation process either.
