Project Description:

This project involves the rehabilitation and reconstruction of the Wailua Sewage Pump Station (SPS) No. 3 facility, which is part of the municipal Wailua-Kapa'a Wastewater System.

The SPS was constructed and put into service in the late 1960s and is a pre-packaged or "can type" pump station with separate concrete wet well and steel dry well. The dry well is approximately 25 feet below ground level and accessed via an elevator. The dry well contains mechanical and electrical equipment such as pumps, motors, piping, valves, controls, a ventilation fan and other accessories.

The proposed rehabilitation and reconstruction will involve converting the dry well/wet well configuration to a wet pit configuration. The existing mechanical and electrical equipment will be removed and the dry well will be abandoned in place. The wet well will be modified to accommodate the new submersible pumps. Valves and a flow meter will be above ground for safer operation and maintenance (O&M) and located above the abandoned dry well. New electrical equipment will also be installed at grade in a cabinet on a concrete platform to keep electrical equipment above the flood elevation. A six foot high chain link fence with personnel gate and rolling gate will be installed around the perimeter of the pump station. The chain link fence will have vinyl slats for privacy similar to the existing condition. Modification of the influent piping is proposed, which involves reducing the number of influent pipes from two to one. Flow will be diverted from an existing manhole, through 69 linear feet of 10-inch sewer pipe and two new manholes to the existing 15-inch pipe flowing into the pump station. The proposed reconstruction and

modifications will be generally on the same site, with the same capacity and purpose with the exemption descriptions provided below.

The Department of Public Works, Wastewater Management Division anticipates that there will be minimal or no significant effect on the environment due to the location, size and scope of the project.

Exemption Class Number: 2

Exemption Item Description from Agency Exemption List:

<u>Class 2</u>: Replacement or reconstruction of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located generally on the same site and will have substantially the same purpose, capacity, density, height and dimensions as the structure replaced.

<u>Item 3</u>: Replacement, reconstruction, alteration, modification (no change in use), or installation of utility services, including, but not limited to:

- a.
